

# Focus on Seniors

## A Closer Look at Resources for Northwest Corridor Seniors

**W**e've all heard the dire forecasts about the Aging of America, the Senior Boom, and the Silver Tsunami. According to a recent Huffington Post article, "The Silver Tsunami is Coming, Are We Ready?" Mark Horvath writes, "Between 2010 and 2030, the number of older Americans will double, to 72.1 Million," and "for the first time in history, people over 65 will outnumber children under 5."

According to Maryland Department of Aging statistics, "The number of older Marylanders is increasing. Of the 5.3 million people in Maryland in 2000, 15 percent (801,036) were over the age of 60. The percentage is expected to increase to 25 percent of Maryland's projected population of 6.7 million by the year 2030."

Seniors living in Baltimore County have a distinct advantage over many seniors in other parts of the state and nation. The county's network of 20 senior centers and the scope and variety of programs and resources offered by the county's Department of Aging can greatly improve the quality of life for seniors and their Baby Boomer colleagues - who began turning 65 last year and will bring with them the largest senior population the country has ever seen.

And here in Baltimore County, they can find the help, resources, and activities they need to enjoy the next phase of their lives.

"The foundation of who we are and what we do here in the **Department of Aging** is to strengthen the lives, help to maintain the lives of older adults so that they can remain independent members of the community here in Baltimore County," Department of Aging Director Joanne Williams says in a department video. "We're charged with serving a whole spectrum of individuals from the younger seniors the 55, 65, 75-year-old, and even into their 80s 90s. And we have a few folks who are in their 100s that we serve."

**At Senior Centers serving the Fourth District**, including the Liberty, Reisterstown, and Woodlawn centers, members stay active and informed with activities ranging from health screenings and work-out classes, to music, arts and history programs, to excursions around Maryland and as far away as Las Vegas and Hawaii. In addition, 13 of the county's 20 centers, including Liberty and Reisterstown, have state-of-the-art fitness centers. For more information on Fourth District Senior Centers, go to:

**Affordable senior housing** continues to be a challenge across the county, as well as comprehensive housing, where seniors can stay at the same facility and move through different levels of care as needed. The Community Resource Directory has an exhaustive listing of senior housing options.

Senior Apartment complexes in the Northwest Corridor include Catholic Charities at Owings Mills, The Greens at Liberty Road and Meadows of Reisterstown, and Old Court Estates in Randallstown.

Genesis Healthcare operates a Nursing Center in Randallstown, while FutureCare operates centers in Randallstown and Reisterstown. Many small assisted living facilities for 5- 15 residents, dot the Northwest area, in Reisterstown, but mostly are located in Randallstown and Woodlawn.

Larger assisted living facilities for 16 or more residents include Atrium Village in Owings Mills, and Augsburg Lutheran in Woodlawn.



**New Life Healthy Living Assisted Living**

A new facility opened recently in the Northwest Corridor at 7600 Clays Lane, just off Rolling Road in Windsor Mill. New Life Healthy Living Assisted Living offers multiple levels of care, with Independent Living units, Assisted Living, Dementia and Alzheimer Care, Skilled Nursing Care, Respite Care, Rehab Care and Day Care.

"We offer 24-hour care, so you can have peace of mind," says Director of Admissions Audrey Turner. "You don't have to cook anymore. You don't have to clean anymore. But people can still be as independent as they want to be."

The facility has activities and entertainment, a small salon, gift shop, an activity room/movie theater and a dining room/banquet hall.

"We are here to ease families' minds," Turner added. "And our goal is helping people."

Turner urges people to come in for a tour, talk to her, and get information and an assessment on what level of care their loved one might need. Seniors can start at New Life Healthy Living in the Day Care program, and move into one of the assisted living units, Turner said. "If I can put a smile on one person's face, then I've had a good day," she added.



## What's going on around the Northwest Corridor



**C**ouncilman Oliver was pleased to visit Randallstown High recently with Gov. Martin O'Malley, State Schools Superintendent

Dr. Lillian M. Lowery, BCPS Director S. Dallas Dance, and other officials, to celebrate the school's dramatic rise in graduation rates that are now higher than county and state rates. According to BCPS, the governor's visit was prompted by state rates rising 1.4 percent in the past year to 84.97 percent for the class of 2013. In Baltimore County, rates jumped 2.47 percent from 2012 to 2013 for 86.3 percent. **At Randallstown, the graduation rate climbed 10 percent in the past four years. From 80 percent in 2010, to 89.92 percent in 2013.** In addition, Randallstown Principal Jay Ward says, "our dropout rate decreased significantly, from 17.9 percentage points in 2010 down to 6.05 in 2013." BCPS says some gains are due to a combination of programs focusing on academic needs on a student-by-student basis." [www.bcps.org](http://www.bcps.org)




