#### Greetings!

The warm spring weather has finally arrived. Crocuses, jonquils and daffodils are out and the sound of lawn mowers and weed trimmers can be heard as residents begin spring cleanup and planting.

Meanwhile, it's FY2015 Budget Season, and my council colleagues and I will be attending many hearings with county agency officials to listen to their budget needs and concerns.

The FY2015 budget, presented recently by the county executive, stays within the County Council's prescribed Spending Affordability Guidelines with a General Fund Operating Budget at \$1.75 billion – a 3.85% increase over the previous year. In addition, the Capital Budget comes in at \$175.7 million. Property and income tax rates remain steady. See inside for budget proposal highlights, including a large new park for the Fourth District.

## Woodstock Job Corps Students Work Hard on Career Goals



Councilman Oliver joined officials and students recently on a beautiful spring day for a comprehensive tour of Woodstock Job Corps Center, 10900 Old Court Road, in Randallstown. The center, once a Jesuit Monastery, is a large wooded campus that includes stately historic stone buildings, some more than 100 years old. The job training complex accommodates 440 residential students and 65 nonresidential students. Most of the students hail from Baltimore City and County.

Students attending Woodstock may earn GEDs, high school diplomas, or training in 15 career tracks, including CAN/GNA, brick

masonry, stationary engineer, carpentry, office administration, security, electrical wiring, medical office support, welding, network cable installation, painter, facilities maintenance, certified medical assistant, and landscape technician. On the day of Councilman Oliver's visit, Center Director Tanisha Nixon updated him on recent activities, including a partnership with the Greater Patapsco Community Association's Annual Community Cleanup Day.

Job Corps students Arielle Askew (Clinical Medical Assistant major) and Malcolm Little (Electrical Systems Technician major) gave the councilman a tour of many of the Woodstock Job Corps classrooms so the councilman could get a first-hand look at students studying academics such as math and English, working on self-paced studies to earn diplomas, and training for career tracks such as security. According to Job Corps figures, 93.5 percent of students that graduate from Woodstock Job Corps Center get jobs placements, and earn on average more than \$10 an hour in those first jobs.

Area employers, including Northwest Hospital, Sojourner Douglass College, Verizon and FutureCare have working partnerships with Woodstock. Students Arielle Askew and Malcolm Little are both active in the center's Student Government Association and are looking forward to college and careers after graduation.



"My plan is to attend college at Coppin State and work for a LifeBridge hospital," Askew said. And with that new job, she's looking forward to a car and her own apartment. For more information on Woodstock Job Corp Center: <http://woodstock.jobcorps.gov>.





## Transitional and Special Needs Students Get Ahead at NCIA



Councilman Oliver was pleased to meet and get to know many of the staff and students at the Woodlawn headquarters of the National Center on Institutions and Alternatives and its affiliated schools and training centers.

Herbert J. Hoelter (Co-Founder, Chairman of the Board, and Chief Executive Officer of NCIA), and Earl S. El-Amin (Vice President of Program Development), led Councilman Oliver on a tour and offered insights about the organization, which was started in 1977 to provide care and treatment for “for intellectually disabled individuals and those involved with the criminal justice system.”

The Woodlawn facilities, clustered near the headquarters on Ambassador Road, include the NCIA Youth in

Transition School for high-schoolers, the NCIA Adult Career Development center and the NCIA Augustus Institute for Mental Health.

Councilman Oliver got a close look at students in workshops and other career-oriented programs in the Career Development center, and visited students and classrooms at the Youth in Transition School where students learn everything from academics to life skills, music, auto mechanics, barbering, and hands-on carpentry. The NCIA offers “residential homes in the community, mental health services and employment training and other related programs for adults and youth. Additionally, NCIA operates a non-public specialized education school accredited by the Maryland State Department of Education for youth in grades 6 through 12.”

In addition, the organization’s criminal justice advocacy services “provides a range of services, such as federal sentencing expertise, prison consultation and parole advocacy to defense attorneys, defendants, inmates and court systems throughout the country. 

## FY2015 Budget Roundup and Fourth District Highlights

With a population that has increased by 18,000 residents in the last four years, Baltimore County is home to 823,000 people - a jurisdiction with more residents than many large cities and even a few states. But not only is Baltimore County large – it is geographically and demographically diverse. So, budgeting for schools, infrastructure, public safety, parks and social services, and other resident needs is a big job.

Baltimore County Council heard County Executive Kevin Kamenetz present his FY 2015 Budget Message to the Council on April 15. After the budget was presented, Baltimore County agency heads and representatives will be presenting their budget concerns and requests to County Council members during the months of April and May. Later in May, the council will vote on and adopt the FY2015 Budget.

Here is a roundup and a few Fourth District highlights:

- \$1.75 billion Operating Budget, an increase of 3.85% over previous year for ongoing expenses.
- \$175.7 million Capital Budget.
- No increase in property tax rate. No increase in income tax rate.
- \$16 million for new fire equipment (12 engines, three ladder trucks, 21 medic units, tools).
- Since 2010: 23 miles of new bikeways, including in Woodlawn.
- \$7.5 million for new technology projects
- Wi-Fi to every county school, project should be complete this year.
- \$1.7 million to expand broadband service to libraries, community centers and senior centers.
- \$1.4 billion education operating budget includes \$1.2 million in start-up costs for a new Owings Mills elementary school: the 700-seat elementary school at Ballard Green.
- Funding to reduce elementary school overcrowding in Randallwood/Imperial Gardens/Stoneybrook with up to 225 new seats
- Funding up to 475 additional seats to reduce overcrowding in Reisterstown and Cedarmere.
- 15.4 % increase in emergency social service funds to mitigate evictions and utility shut-offs.
- \$63 million over next seven years for road resurfacing.
- \$3 million to purchase 257 acres for new regional passive park near Granite.
