ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Honeygo District Threshold Limitations

FOR the purpose of amending the threshold limitations in the Bean Run subarea of the Honeygo Area to which certain regulations are applicable; and generally relating to the threshold limitations in the Honeygo Area.

BY repealing and re-enacting, with amendments

Section 259.7E.1.
Baltimore County Zoning Regulations, as amended

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that Section 259.7E.1. of the Baltimore County Zoning Regulations be
3 and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

1 Section 259.7 Threshold Limits - Honeygo Area

1 E. Subarea threshold limits.

2 1. Bean Run subarea.

3 a. The Director may issue 400 authorizations prior to the commencement of:

4 [(1) Forge Road capital project from Cross Road to Forge View Road; and

5 (2)] THE Cross Road capital project from Honeygo Boulevard to Forge Road.

6 b. The director may issue an additional 650 authorizations after the commencement
7 of the capital project[s] listed in Paragraph a above and prior to the commencement of:

8 (1) Honeygo Boulevard capital project from Cross Road to Joppa Road; and

9 (2) Water main second zone capital project along the length of Honeygo

10 Boulevard, as defined in this paragraph.

11 c. After commencement of the capital projects listed in paragraphs 1.a and 1.b above

12 and prior to commencement of the acquisition of seven contiguous acres of public open space in the

13 Bean Run subarea, the Director may issue up to an additional 200 authorizations for this subarea.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having been passed by the

15 affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect on May 19, 2008.
