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AN ACT concerning

Human Resources - Promotions

FOR the purpose of defining the identification of applicants' written scores in promotional examinations and generally relating to sworn personnel of the Baltimore County Fire and Police Departments.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments

Section 4-8-102, Special Rule 7.04  
Article 4. Human Resources  
Baltimore County Code, 2003

1           SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE  
2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, That Section 4-8-102, Special Rule 7.04 of Article 4. Human  
3 Resources of the Baltimore County Code, 2003, as amended, is hereby repealed and reenacted to  
4 read as follows:

1 § 4-8-102. Special Personnel Rules for Police and Fire Departments.

2 Special Rule No. 7. Promotions

3 Special Rule 7.04. [The identification of the scores of all such written examinations shall  
4 be done in the presence of no less than three (3) of the following: A member of the Department  
5 for which the examination was given, the Director of Human Resources, the Administrative  
6 Officer, and a member of the Personnel and Salary Advisory Board. In the event of the inability  
7 of any one (1) of the three (3) to be present, the County Administrative Officer shall appoint a  
8 person to act as substitute.] THE OFFICE OF HUMAN RESOURCES SHALL DOCUMENT  
9 AN ELECTRONIC OR MANUAL PROCESS FOR THE IDENTIFICATION OF  
10 APPLICANTS' WRITTEN SCORES THAT IS SUBJECT TO OVERSIGHT OR REVIEW BY  
11 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER, MEMBERS OF THE  
12 PERSONNEL AND SALARY ADVISORY BOARD, AND A DESIGNEE OF THE  
13 APPOINTING AUTHORITY FOR WHICH THE EXAMINATION WAS GIVEN.

14 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, this Act, having been passed by  
15 an affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect September 17, 2007.
