ENTITLED

AN ACT concerning

Speed Monitoring System – Signage Requirement

FOR the purpose of providing that the county may not issue a citation from a school zone speed monitoring system until a certain amount of time after certain signage is installed; and generally relating to the school zone speed monitoring systems.

By repealing and reenacting, with amendments

Section 18-4-102
Article 18. Transportation
Baltimore County Code, 2003

1 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE
2 COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the Laws of Baltimore County shall read as follows:
3 Article 18. Transportation
4 § 18-4-102.

1 (A) In accordance with § 21-809 of the Transportation Article of the Annotated Code of
2 Maryland, the county may use and enforce citations issued from speed monitoring systems
3 within the county.

4 (B) IF THE COUNTY MOVES OR PLACES A MOBILE OR STATIONARY SPEED
5 MONITORING SYSTEM TO OR AT A LOCATION WHERE THE SPEED MONITORING
6 SYSTEM HAD NOT PREVIOUSLY BEEN MOVED OR PLACED, THE COUNTY MAY
7 NOT ISSUE A CITATION:

8 (1) UNTIL SIGNAGE IS INSTALLED IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 21-
9 809(B)(1)(VII) OF THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE OF THE ANNOTATED CODE OF
10 MARYLAND; AND

11 (2) FOR AT LEAST THE FIRST 30 CALENDAR DAYS AFTER THE
12 SIGNAGE IS INSTALLED.

13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that Section 2 of Bill 61-09 is hereby
14 repealed and that Sections 3 and 4 of Bill 61-09 are hereby renumbered to be Sections 2 and 3.

15 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, that this Act, having passed by the
16 affirmative vote of five members of the County Council, shall take effect on February 1, 2015.
