A RESOLUTION of the Baltimore County Council for the purpose of expanding the existing boundaries of the Woodlawn Commercial Revitalization District along Security Boulevard to Rolling Road.

WHEREAS, the County has 13 Commercial Revitalization Districts that have been officially designated, either by resolution of the County Council or by adoption of Master Plan or Master Plan amendment; and

WHEREAS, a portion of the Woodlawn Commercial Revitalization District currently extends along Security Boulevard on the east side of I-695; and

WHEREAS, the new revitalization district boundaries will connect a specific commercial property located adjacent to Security Boulevard on the west side of I-695 with the existing boundaries of the Woodlawn Commercial Revitalization District, namely, the Security Square Mall; and

WHEREAS, the Commercial Revitalization Districts provide incentives to property owners and businesses in the Districts to improve the exterior of existing buildings and to develop and/or redevelop underused properties; and

WHEREAS, the County Council deems it appropriate to expand the Woodlawn Commercial Revitalization District to include the Security Square Mall in the existing district; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE COUNTY, MARYLAND, that the following area, as shown on Exhibit A attached hereto, is hereby established as the new boundaries for the Woodlawn Commercial Revitalization District; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution shall be sent to the Department of Economic Development, the Office of Planning, the Department of Public Works and the Office of Community Conservation to be used for programming departmental operations; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect from the date of its enactment.
