A Resolution of the County Council requesting the Baltimore County Office of Planning and the Department of Economic Development to develop a revitalization plan for the Main Street commercial corridor of Reisterstown.

WHEREAS, the County Council has designated Reisterstown as a commercial revitalization district in which specific County sponsored programs are available in order to enhance the development potential of the district; and

WHEREAS, the Reisterstown commercial corridor serves not only as a highway to carry traffic but also as an access for neighboring residential areas to a wide range of shopping, dining, and other personal service opportunities; and

WHEREAS, the Main Street corridor is a vital area within the district that is composed of many restored buildings occupied by specialty shops and services; and

WHEREAS, the County Council believes that a revitalization plan is needed for the Main Street corridor to serve as a guide for the development of the Reisterstown Main Street corridor;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Council of Baltimore County, Maryland, that the Baltimore County Office of Planning and the Department of Economic Development are requested to develop a Reisterstown Main Street Revitalization Plan; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Office of Planning and the Department of Economic Development shall include in their plan development process representatives of all areas of the Reisterstown population, including representatives of local residential community associations and local business and property owners.
