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A RESOLUTION to purchase easements under the Imminently Threatened Farm Preservation Program.

WHEREAS, the Imminently Threatened Farm Preservation Program authorizes the county to purchase agricultural preservation easements for farms without regard to the priority ranking list then in effect; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Environmental Protection and Resource Management, upon recommendation of the Agricultural Land Preservation Advisory Board, has determined that the threats to a farm located at 1800 Knox Avenue and owned by Branchwater Farms, Inc. (William H. Suchting and Doreen B. Suchting) and a farm located at 500 Freeland Road and owned by Glenda L. Price and Elmer E. Price meet the criteria for Imminent Threat and are recommended for purchase through the Imminently Threatened Farm Preservation Program;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE COUNTY, MARYLAND, that in accordance with § 24-3-201 of the Baltimore County Code, 2003, as amended, the County Council authorizes the County purchase of an agricultural land preservation easement over a farm located at 1800 Knox Avenue and owned by Branchwater Farms, Inc. (William H. Suchting and Doreen B. Suchting) and a farm located at 500 Freeland Road and owned by Glenda L. Price and Elmer E. Price without regard to the priority ranking list established under § 24-3-107 of the Baltimore County Code, 2003, as amended; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect from the date of its enactment.
