

STREAM SENSE

This location has been identified as having potential for recurring sanitary sewer overflows during and following heavy rainfall.

Storm water runoff from streets, parking lots, fields and lawns, as well as occasional leaks or overflows from the sanitary sewer system, may carry pollutants that negatively affect stream water quality, causing a potential health risk.

Follow these guidelines and use your “Stream Sense” whenever you use our rivers and streams:

- Avoid or minimize contact with natural waters whenever they are cloudy or immediately after storms and heavy rain.
- Do not drink stream water.
- Avoid hand to mouth contact when possible. Wash your hands before eating, after working or playing in a stream.
- Minimize water contact with open wounds or cuts, and wash with soap and water after contact with a stream.
