HISTORY

The Master Settlement Agreement (MSA) was signed in November, 1998, by Attorneys General in 46 states and five U.S. territories and the tobacco industry.

The agreement resolved lawsuits filed by the Attorneys General against the tobacco industry and provided states with funding for tobacco and cancer programs, among other programs. The Maryland Legislature enacted Senate Bill 896/House Bill 1425 in April, 2000, which created the Cigarette Restitution Fund (CRF).

A portion of the CRF oversees the funds to local health departments' CRF cancer programs for cancer prevention, education, screening, and treatment for eligible individuals in Baltimore County.
