FINDINGS OF FACT AND CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
FINAL ORDER OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE

This matter came before the Administrative Law Judge on January 17, 2012 for a Hearing on a citation for violations under the Baltimore County Code (BCC) section 13-4-201 (d), failure to store garbage in containers with tight fitting lids on residential property.

On December 14, 2011, pursuant to § 3-6-205, Baltimore County Code, Inspector Patrick Williams issued a Code Enforcement & Inspections Citation. The citation was sent to the Respondent by 1st class mail to the last known address listed in the Maryland State Tax Assessment files.

The citation proposed a civil penalty of \$50.00 (fifty dollars).

The following persons appeared for the Hearing and testified: Francis Culotta, Respondent and, Patrick Williams, Baltimore County Code Enforcement Officer.

Testimony was presented that an inspection of the subject property on 12/14/11 revealed garbage cans without proper lids and a garbage bag on the ground. The Respondent testified that he believed the bag had been moved there by a neighbor.

Having heard the testimony and evidence presented at the Hearing:

IT IS ORDERED by the Administrative Law Judge that a civil penalty be imposed in the amount of \$50.00 (fifty dollars).

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the \$50.00 civil penalty be suspended in full.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the \$50.00 civil penalty will be imposed if the property is not brought into immediate compliance.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if the property is brought into compliance pursuant to this Order, the \$50.00 civil penalty will be imposed if there is a subsequent finding against the Respondent for the same violation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if not paid within thirty days of billing, the civil penalty AND any expenses incurred by Baltimore County, as authorized above, shall be imposed and placed as a lien upon the property.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the County inspect the property to determine whether the violations have been corrected.
