


FIRE HYDRANT CONNECTION PERMIT REGULATIONS

- Metered Hydrant connections shall not be used to supply potable water for domestic usage.
- Only the regulation fire hydrant wrench supplied with this connection shall be used to open or close the hydrant. Any damage to the hydrant from usage of a pipe wrench or other unauthorized implement shall be charged to the permit holder.
- Permit holder is liable for all damage to the fire hydrant, the metered connection, and property in the vicinity of the fire hydrant.
- Gate Valve on the metered connection must be in the closed position whenever the fire hydrant is being opened or closed. Fire hydrant valve must be fully opened with the flow of water controlled by the gate valve on the metered connection.
- Only those fire hydrant locations listed on this permit may be used.
- Permit may be cancelled or changed at any time to meet water system operational requirements.
- Fire hydrants shall not be used when the temperature is below freezing.
- Only the 2 ½ inch nozzle on the fire hydrant shall be used.
- Fire hydrants shall not be opened unless a metered connection is used.
- Access to any fire hydrant shall not be restricted.
- Immediately respond to all instructions from fire department personnel.
- All water transporters must have permanently mounted piping that utilizes an air gap device for the filling process. This air gap device must be inspected prior to the issuance of a permit.
- A 3" metered hydrant connection can only be used with an approved air cp system for filling of truck/trailer mounted tanks and tanker trailers.
- A copy of this permit must be in the possession of the person operating the metered connection at all times.
- Hydrant metered connection must be returned to the Bureau of Utilities at 11112 Gilroy Road, on or before the expiration date stated on the permit.
- Security deposit shall be forfeited for any violation of the regulations or misuse of the metered connection or if permit is 30 days over expiration date.
- Security deposits do not earn interest. Refunds less rental fees; water consumption charges; and repair/replacement costs shall be made after metered hydrant connection is returned.
- Consumption charges and rental fees shall be determined and billed at six month intervals or when meter is returned, whichever occurs first.
- Immediately report any hydrant malfunction to the Bureau of Utilities at 410-887-1885.


